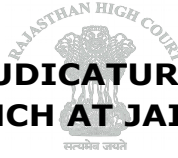

1. These present bail applications have been filed by the petitioners Raees S/o Sh. Ikramuddin and Vikas Bhankal S/o Shri Ravindra Bhankal, who were arrested by the police in connection with the FIR bearing No.12/2024 dated 03.12.2024 registered at Cyber Police Station, District ATS & SOG for the offences punishable under Sections 308(6), 318(4), 319(2), 111(4) and 204 of BNS, 2023 and Section 66D of IT Act, 2000.



2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that after more than two years, the present bail applications have been filed on account of the fact that the petitioners have not committed any offence and have been falsely implicated in the present cases. In view thereof, learned counsel prays that the accused-petitioners may be enlarged on bail.

3. Learned Public Prosecutor strongly opposes these bail applications and submits that the status report submitted by the police dated 13.05.2026 shows several serious offences and trail of money at different layers. It is further submitted that the transactions are in respect of number of States in the country which shows that the petitioners have formed a gang which commits cyber crime.

4. After considering the record as produced before this Court by way of status report, this Court finds the conduct of the petitioners to be serious in nature wherein huge sum is involved, however, looking to the contents of the FIR and the overall facts and circumstances of the case, this court is not inclined to enlarge the present petitioners on bail.

5. Accordingly, these criminal misc. bail applications are dismissed.
