1. These bail applications under Section 483 of BNSS are filed
by the applicants-accused **Ajay Singh Son of Shri
Joginder Singh** and **Sunil Son of Shri Mangat Singh**,
seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR
No.19/2026 dated 19.04.2026 registered at P.S. Phulera

(GRP Ajmer), District - GRP Ajmer, for the offence under Sections 8/15 of NDPS Act.

2. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that the applicants have been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against them is complete and they are no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicants accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submits that the applicants undertake not to repeat offence and cooperate with trial, which will take time.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners to submits that the police has not complied mandatory provisions under the NDPS Act before effecting search and seizure. He also submits that the petitioners were not given an opportunity to be searched in presence of a Magistrate. He further submits that as per police, 10.020 kg poppy straw was recovered from possession of Ajay Singh whereas 20.080 kg was recovered from possession of Sunil. He further submits that a total of 30.100 kg poppy straw were allegedly recovered from these petitioners. He further submits that individually and jointly, the recovered quantity is less than commercial. He further submits that there is one criminal case against Sunil but there is no criminal antecedents against Ajay Singh.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail applications and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature. He has also filed a report received from concerned Police Station.

5. Heard learned counsel for the parties and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On 19th April 2026, SHO PS Phulera (GRP Ajmer), District GRP Ajmer has intercepted both the petitioners at platform number 3, Sambhar Lake Railway Station and he found both the petitioners with three bags. On search has recovered 10.020 kg poppy straw from Ajay Singh, and 20.080 kg poppy straw in two bags from Sunil. The recovered quantity, individually and jointly, is less than commercial quantity. There is one criminal case against Ajay Singh and that too under the IPC.
7. Upon hearing the arguments and perusing the record, we have found that the applicants-accused are no more required in the investigation and they are in custody for quite some time. The further proceedings will take its own time, therefore, looking to entirety of facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicants-accused.
8. Thus, these bail applications filed on behalf of applicants-accused **Ajay Singh Son of Shri Joginder Singh** and **Sunil Son of Shri Mangat Singh**, are hereby allowed and the applicants-accused are ordered to be released on bail with condition that each of the petitioner would furnish a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-

- (i) The applicants-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
- (ii) The applicants-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
- (iii) The applicants-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.
- (iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicants-accused shall be liable to be canceled.
