1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Bhagwan Singh alias Pappu Singh S/o Kishore Singh**, seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.07/2026 dated 10.01.2026 registered at P.S. Pirawa, District - Jhalawar, for the offence under Sections 8/20 and 8/25 of NDPS Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. She further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. She also submits that the

applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has not been named in the FIR and he has been arrayed as an accused only on the statement of co-accused. She further submits that the recovery is effected from Ishwar Gurjar and Bharat Kumar. She further referred the process of investigation and submitted that the police has not complied the mandatory provision under the NDPS Act before effecting search and seizure. She further submits that no independent witness was called by police at the time of effecting search and seizure. She also submits that neither there is any independent evidence nor any other material to connect present petitioner with other accused to frame charge under Section 29 of NDPS Act.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature. He has also filed a report received from concerned Police Station.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On 10.01.2026, SHO, PS Pirawa, District Jhalawar, has intercepted a motorcycle which was driven by Ishwar Gurjar and Bharat Kumar was pillion rider and they were carrying a gunny bag containing ganja. On search, the police has recovered 25.370 kg of ganja. After recovery, FIR No. 7/2026 dated 10.01.2026 was registered under Sections

8/20 and 25 of NDPS Act at PS Pirawa, District Jhalawar. At the time of search, the accused Ishwar Gurjar and Bharat Kumar have named the present petitioner as source of ganja and this fact was mentioned in FIR by police. The recovered quantity is a commercial quantity. Till date, the accused, from whom the recovery was effected, are also in custody.

7. The facts and the material indicate that the alleged offence are of serious nature and role attributed to applicant is prima facie sufficient to consider complicity of applicant in the crime. Therefore, at this juncture, considering the evidence collected so far, this is not a fit case to enlarge the applicant accused on bail.
8. Considering the gravity of allegations and overall facts and circumstances of the case, it is appropriate to dismiss the bail application of the applicant accused at this stage.
9. Accordingly, the application for bail filed under Section 483 of BNSS preferred by the applicant-accused **Bhagwan Singh alias Pappu Singh S/o Kishore Singh**, is hereby dismissed.
