1. The present anticipatory bail application has been filed by the accused-petitioner under Section 482 of B.N.S.S (438 of Cr.P.C.) in connection with F.I.R. No.01/2025 registered at Cyber Police Station (Baran), District Baran for the offence(s) punishable under Section(s) 316(3), 318(4) & 319(2) of BNS and Section(s) 66-D of I.T. Act.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case as she has nothing to do with the alleged offences. Learned counsel further submits that the alleged offences are triable by Magistrate and petitioner has no criminal antecedent. Learned counsel also submits that the petitioner and complainant have amicably entered into a compromise dated 12.04.2026. Hence, the petitioner may be given the benefit of anticipatory bail.
3. Learned counsel for the complainant admits the fact of having entered into compromise with the petitioner. He further submits that the complainant has no objection if the petitioner is given the benefit of the anticipatory bail.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor opposes the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner hereinabove.

5. Taking into consideration the overall facts & circumstances of the case; the arguments advanced by learned counsel for the petitioner, the fact that the case is triable by Magistrate, and parties have already entered into compromise but without commenting anything upon the merits /demerits of the case, this Court deems it just and proper to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

6. Accordingly, the anticipatory bail application under Section 482 B.N.S.S. is **allowed** and it is ordered that in the event of arrest of accused-petitioner namely, **Shivani Yadav D/o Dharamraj Yadav**, in connection with FIR No.01/2025 registered at Cyber Police Station (Baran), District Baran, she shall be released on bail, provided she furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the SHO/IO/Arresting Officer of the concerned Police Station on the following conditions:-

(i) The accused-petitioner shall make herself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required.

(ii) The accused-petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or any police officer, and

(iii) that the petitioner shall not leave India without previous permission of the Court.
