Order

1. Accused-petitioner has filed this Criminal Writ Petition (Parole) seeking third regular parole for a period of 40 days.
2. It is contended by counsel for the petitioner that parole application of the petitioner was rejected on the ground that the jail conduct of the petitioner is not satisfactory and the Social Welfare Department has also not recommended his case for grant of parole. It is further contended that the petitioner has remained in custody for a period of more than sixteen years and there was no justification in rejecting his parole application.

3. Learned GA-cum-AAG as well as Additional Government Advocate has opposed the writ petition. It is contended that the report of the Social Welfare Department is against the petitioner and the Social Welfare Department has also not recommended his case for grant of parole.

4. In counter to the above, counsel for the petitioner further submitted that on earlier six times the petitioner availed the parole during which he has not violated any of the conditions of parole, as reported by the Superintendent of Police, District Kota.

5. We have considered the contentions advanced by counsel for the parties and perused the material came on record.

6. Considering the fact that the petitioner has remained in custody for a period of more than sixteen years; thus as per the Rajasthan Prisoners on Parole Rules, 1958, he is entitled for parole; though his jail conduct is not satisfactory and Social Welfare Department has also not recommended his case for grant of parole but there is no tangible documentary evidence in support thereof on record, to deny the prayer for grant of third regular parole, hence in these facts and circumstances as well as the material before us, we deem it proper to allow the present writ petition (parole) and set aside the order/recommendations dated 08.04.2026.

7. Civil Writ Petition (Parole) is accordingly allowed. The order/recommendation of the Parole Advisory Committee dated 08.04.2026 qua the present petitioner is quashed. The Jail Authorities are directed to release the petitioner on third regular parole for a period of 40 days on furnishing of his personal bond of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of

the Superintendent, Central Jail, Kota with the stipulation that he shall surrender himself before the Jail Authorities on the expiry of the parole period and shall maintain peace and tranquility during the parole period.

8. In case of his failure to surrender by stipulated date, the Jail Authorities shall proceed in accordance with law.
