1. Today, no one appeared on behalf of the petitioners.
2. In this civil contempt petition, the issue of non-compliance of final order dated 23.03.2021, passed in D.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 2411/2021, has been raised.

3. Vide final order dated 23.03.2021, petitioners were granted liberty to make a representation before the PLPC, to remove the encroachers from the Government Forest Land of Khasra Nos. 435 and 437, situated in Village Raipur, Tehsil Weir, District Bharatpur.

4. From the side of respondents, apart from filing the compliance report dated 04.09.2023, an additional affidavit along with factual report of compliance dated 03.11.2025 have been placed on record and it has been stated that out of total 0.44 Hectare land of Forest, encroachments from 0.303 Hectare have completely been removed. Only the construction of Government School and residential houses of eight encroachers could not be removed as same may create disturbance of law and order situation and may affect life and liberty of concerned persons.

5. Petitioners were granted opportunity to file counter affidavit to the compliance report vide order dated 10.11.2025, but despite of that opportunity, no counter affidavit has been filed by and on behalf of the petitioners, showing any disagreement with the compliance made by the respondents.

6. In view of the compliance report, it is apparent that substantial compliance has been made and huge encroachment from the Government Forest Land has been removed, hence, in light of the action taken and proceedings initiated, it cannot, by any stretch of imagination, be inferred that no compliance of order dated 23.03.2021 has been made. Substantial explanation for not removing Government School and residential houses has also been furnished as noted above. Therefore, it is not a clear cut case of deliberate or willful non-compliance of the order dated 23.03.2021.

7. Consequently, the proceedings of instant contempt petition are closed and the contempt petition is hereby dismissed. Notices of contempt stand discharged accordingly.
