Order

1. The present writ petition has been filed being aggrieved by the order dated 08.06.2020 (Annexure-2), vide which the petitioner who was working on deputation as a Food Safety Officer at the Office of the Chief Medical and Health Officer, Chittorgarh, has been placed under suspension.
2. Mr. Rajesh Prasad Gautam with Mr. Anil Kumar Shukla, learned counsel for the petitioner, submits that it has been more than six years that the impugned order was passed, whereby the

petitioner was placed under suspension. Learned counsel submits that keeping the petitioner under suspension for such a prolonged period is in sheer defiance of the circular dated 22.03.2023 issued by the State of Rajasthan.

3. Learned counsel also submits that in the FIR filed against the petitioner, even the charge-sheet (challan) has been filed way back on 18.03.2025.

4. Learned counsel further submits that till date, the case of the petitioner for revocation of suspension has not been earnestly considered in light of the circular dated 22.03.2023 and with the passage of time, the suspension itself has taken the form of a punishment, which is not what the law provides.

5. Taking note of the same, issue notice to respondents.

6. Mr. Archit Bohra, learned AGC, appears and accepts notice on behalf of all the respondents.

7. Hence, service stands complete.

8. Learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to serve a copy of the writ petition in the Office of Mr. Archit Bohra, learned AGC, within three days from today.

9. Learned AGC prays for and is granted four weeks' time to file reply, which should necessarily indicate the reasons and grounds for continuation of suspension for a period of more than six years.

10. List the matter on 30.09.2026.

11. Taking note of the unprecedented length of the suspension period of the petitioner, the suspension order dated 08.06.2020 (Annexure-2) shall remain stayed.
