1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner seeking following reliefs:-

"In view of the facts and circumstances stated hereinabove, it is therefore most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to:-

(I) By appropriate writ, order or direction quash and set aside the impugned Corrigendum dated 26.05.2026 to the extent it prescribes five years' experience as eligibility condition;

(II) Declare the impugned condition of five years' experience arbitrary, illegal, discriminatory and violative of Articles 14 and 19(1)(g) of the Constitution of India;

(III) Direct the respondents to accept and consider the bid of the petitioner without insisting upon the impugned condition of five years' experience;

(IV) Restrain the respondents from finalising the tender process pursuant to the impugned corrigendum during pendency of the writ petition;

(V) Pass any other appropriate relief, which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit, just and proper in the interest of justice in favour of the petitioner."

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that last day of submission of bid is tomorrow i.e. 04.06.2026 and conditions imposed by the respondents are against the principles of natural justice as well as violative of Article 14 and Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution of India. Learned counsel prays that that the respondents be restrained from inviting any bid.

3. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

4. Looking to the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is not inclined to grant any interim relief in favour of the petitioner.

5. Issue notice of the petition as well as stay application to the respondents by both modes i.e., by ordinary process as well as by registered post, returnable within four weeks. Notices be given 'dasti', as prayed.

6. List the matter on 03.07.2026.

7. However, it is made clear that the contract issued by the respondents in furtherance to the bid in question, shall be subject to the outcome of the present writ petition.
