1. The petitioners have preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.24/2025 registered at Police Station Mishroli, District Jhalawar for offences under Sections 189(2), 126(2), 121(1), 132, 109(1), 221 and 296(a) of BNS, 2023 and Section 3 of PDPP Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that the similarly situated co-accused, namely Umesh, Nirmal and Udai Singh, who have been named in the FIR, have already been

enlarged on bail by this Hon'ble Court vide order dated 08.04.2025. The case of the present petitioners stands on the same footing as that of the aforesaid co-accused and is, therefore, entitled to the benefit of parity. He further submits that all the injuries allegedly sustained by the injured are simple in nature. Petitioners are behind the bars since 20.05.2026 without any criminal past. The trial of the case will take considerable time, therefore, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners in further custody, consequently, the bail application of the petitioners may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in light of submissions made on behalf of petitioners but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioners.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioners **Manohar Singh S/o Amar Singh, Rai Singh Alais Bau Singh S/o Amar Singh** and **Prakash S/o Vijay**, be released on bail provided each of them furnish a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that they shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
