HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE ANUROOP SINGHI (V.J.)
Order

22/06/2026

1. The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioners with the following prayers:-

"It is, therefore, humbly prayed that your Lordships may graciously be pleased to accept and allow this writ petition and further be pleased to issue appropriate writ/order/direction to the respondents to the following effect:

- 1. by an appropriate writ, order or direction, the respondents may kindly be directed to forthwith issue relieving orders in favour of the petitioners so as to enable them to join the one-year Senior Residency Course in pursuance of the Office Order dated 09.06.2026, within such time as may be fixed by this Hon'ble Court;*
- 2. by an appropriate writ, order or direction, the respondents may kindly be restrained from taking any adverse action against the petitioners or treating their Senior Residency allotment as lapsed/non-joined on account of non-issuance or delayed issuance of relieving orders;*
- 3. by an appropriate writ, order or direction, the respondents may kindly be directed to extend all consequential benefits to the petitioners arising out of their joining of the Senior Residency Course.*
- 4. Any other order or direction which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit, just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case may also be passed in favour of the petitioners."*

2. Mr. Akshay Singh, learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, has placed reliance on an interim order dated 20.02.2026 passed in **S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.3529/2026**, titled as "**Dr. Rahul Ranwan & Ors. Vs. State of Rajasthan & Ors.**", wherein the respondents have been directed to relieve the petitioners therein for joining the Senior Residency Course.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents very fairly accepts the fact that the case of the petitioners stands covered by the directions issued in the order dated 20.02.2026. The operative portion of the order dated 20.02.2026 reads as under:-

"This Court is conscious of the judicial discipline, propriety and consistency which is required to be followed and maintained and which is the hallmark of the judicial system and thus, taking note of the above aspects, this Court is inclined to grant the petitioners the same interim relief as has been granted by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court in the orders referred above.

Accordingly, the respondents are directed to relieve the petitioners latest by tomorrow i.e., 21.02.2026 and permit them to join the Senior Residency Course pursuant to the allotment letter dated 04.02.2026.

List the matter along with S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.3139/2026 on 17.03.2026, on or before which, learned counsel for the respondents may file reply to the writ petition."

- 4.** Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that vide office order dated 09.06.2026 (Annexure-4), the petitioners have been directed to join for Senior Residency Course within 15 days from 09.06.2026 and they have already submitted their applications praying for their relieving. However, the same is yet to be considered by the respondent-authorities.
- 5.** Taking note of the aforementioned facts, the respondents are directed to relieve the petitioners latest by tomorrow, i.e. 23.06.2026 and to permit them to join the Senior Residency Course in pursuance to the Office Order dated 09.06.2026.
- 6.** List the matter along with S.B. Civil Writ Petition No.3529/2026.
- 7.** In the meanwhile, learned counsel for the respondents may file reply to the writ petition.
