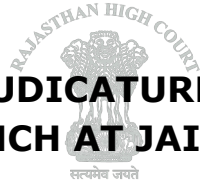

1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that although, the petitioner was selected pursuant to recruitment process on the post of Senior Teacher initiated by Rajasthan Public Service Commission, Ajmer at the instance of respondent-department, yet only on account of the fact that due to ailing health, the petitioner could not participate in document verification process and he was not selected and appointed on the aforesaid post.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner also submits that in case, the document verification process is still going on and final

select list/appointment orders pursuant to advertisement dated 31.01.2024 have not been issued, then the respondents may consider the candidature of the petitioner and may also allow him an opportunity for document verification and in case, the documents are in order, then further directions for appointment may also be given.

3. Learned counsel for RPSC accepted notices under the directions of this Court and submitted that admittedly, there is no fault of respondent-Commission and the information with regard to document verification was given well in time, therefore, under these circumstances, the petitioner is not entitled for further consideration in the process.

4. I have considered the submissions.

5. It is settled that the recruitment examination is conducted as per the scheme of examination given in the advertisement in accordance with the rule and no person can be allowed to pray for any exceptional opportunity beyond the terms and conditions of the advertisement.

6. Be that as it may, looking to the limited prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court observes that the petitioner shall be at liberty to submit a fresh representation along with requisite documents, which shall be considered and decided by respondent-Commission strictly in accordance with law, in case the process of recruitment is not yet over. The entire exercise shall be conducted within a period of 60 days from the date of receipt of representation along with certified copy of this order.

7. Writ Petition is accordingly disposed of.

8. It is made clear that this Court has not expressed any opinion on merits of the case.

9. Pending application(s), if any, stand(s) disposed of.
