1. Learned counsel for the respondent at the outset states that he will not press his stay vacation application, if learned Appellate Court is directed to decide the appeal as expeditiously as possible.
2. Learned counsel for the respondent further submits that the suit was filed in 1986, and the first decree in favor of the plaintiff-

respondent was passed on 06.05.2023. Against this, an appeal was filed by the petitioner, which was partly allowed on 20.11.2023, and the matter was remanded back to the learned Trial Court.

3. The learned Trial Court subsequently passed a decree on 20.11.2023, against which an appeal is pending.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner could not dispute the above prayer.

5. Heard.

6. This Court deems it appropriate to confirm the order dated 26.09.2025 passed by this Court until the disposal of the first appeal.

7. The learned Appellate Court is also directed to decide the appeal as expeditiously as possible, preferably within six months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

8. With the aforesaid observations, the present Civil Writ Petition stands disposed of.

9. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
