1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the learned Trial Court, while deciding his application, refused to permit the exhibition of the certified copy of the *patta* obtained by him. The

Court also declined the prayer to direct the Gram Panchayat to produce the entire record on the basis of which the *patta* had been issued.

2. After arguing the matter for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he may be permitted to file an application before the learned Trial Court seeking permission to lead secondary evidence with respect to the certified copy of the *patta* dated 15.07.1981.

3. Heard.

4. This Court does not find any reason to interfere with the impugned order dated 01.09.2025. However, the petitioner shall be at liberty to file an application seeking permission to lead secondary evidence with regard to the certified copy of the *patta* dated 15.07.1981. If such an application is filed, the learned Trial Court is expected to decide the same in accordance with law as expeditiously as possible.

5. With the above observations, the present civil writ petition stands disposed of.

6. All pending applications also stand disposed of.
