1. It is informed by learned counsel for the respondent that vide order dated 17.12.2025, representation submitted by petitioner was decided.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in para-6 of the order dated 16.07.2025, the court considered and opined that "three days delay in filing of application is not fatal and the same

should not have been rejected on this technical count alone". It is contended that after submitting the representation the respondent have dismissed the representation on the grounds of delay, therefore they have not complied with the order and made contempt of the court.

3. Heard and perused the material available on the record.

4. Annexure CPR/1 was passed by the concerned authority on 17.12.2025. Dismissal of the petitioner's representation was based not only on the basis of delay but with regard to other aspects also. The Office order also reflects that petitioner submitted his representation assigning several reasons and after considering all the reasons cited in the representation, the representation was decided. No contempt is made out, if petitioner is still aggrieved by the said order passed by the respondent then the petitioner is free to approach the appropriate forum for redressal of his grievance.

5. The contempt petition stands disposed of. The rule is discharged.
