It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that although vide orders dated 13.3.2018 /11.4.2018 /24.5.2018 /30.7.2018, the writ petitions were disposed of with a direction to the petitioner(s) to address a comprehensive representation enclosing a copy of the adjudication in the case of Balram Verma Versus The Union of India & Ors. - S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 18106/2012; decided on 18.11.2017 and the respondents were directed to consider and decide the same by a reasoned and speaking order, as expeditiously as possible, in accordance with law. The respondents have partly complied with the order(s), but the pensionary benefits and interest thereon has not been paid to the petitioner(s), whereas in similar cases, pensionary benefits and the interest thereon has been paid by them.

On the other hand, learned AAG appearing for the respondents submits that in the orders dated 13.3.2018 / 11.4.2018 /24.5.2018 /30.7.2018, there was no direction for payment of pensionary benefits and interest thereon. However, in view of the Balram Verma's case (supra), pensionary benefits and interest thereon has been paid to other persons in similar cases. It is also submitted that the matter for giving pensionary benefits has been sent to the Pension Department and it is likely to take some time. For this reason, he seeks time.

Six weeks' time is granted to submit compliance report.
