In the High Court of Uttarakhand, the present case arises from Bail Application filed under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, seeking regular bail for the Applicant – Ayush Thakur, who has been accused in FIR/Case Crime No.03 of 2026, under Sections 8/20/60 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station Mori, District Uttarkashi.</p> <p>4. The allegation against the Applicant in the FIR is that from his possession, the contraband <i>charas</i> (cannabis) weighing 1348 Kg, was seized.</p> <p>5. The primary objections of the learned counsel for the Applicant for the consideration of the bail is that the Applicant has been falsely implicated in the present matter as he was merely a Taxi Driver, and the passenger who was in the car may be in the possession of the said contraband and the alleged recovery that found was shown from his possession; after the inspection of the search party, the passenger fled and he was made accused of the possession of the contraband in the present matter.</p> <p>6.
