Gill, learned counsel for the revisionists. 2. Mr. Tumul Nainwal, learned A.G.A. with Mrs. Sweta Badola Dobhal, learned Brief Holder for the State. 3. The instant criminal revision has been preferred by the revisionists, who are five in numbers, challenging the judgment and order passed by the Trial Court convicting each of them for the offences punishable under sections 147, 323 r/w section 34, 452 r/w 34 and 504 r/w section 34, P.S. Ramnagar, District Nainital with the maximum sentence of six months simple imprisonment and fine of Rs. 2,000 each. The conviction and sentence was also confirmed in the appeal. 4. As per office report the revision is well within time. 5. Admit. 6. Summon the Trial Court record. 7. Heard on exemption application. 8. It is argued by the learned counsel for the revisionist that the revisionist has no criminal antecedent and even the complainant herein is the close relative and the conviction is bad in law since the Trial Court while convicting them observed that the prosecution proved their case partly. He further submits that since the maximum sentence is only six months simple imprisonment, therefore, the revisionist may be permitted to be exempted from surrender. 9. The State counsel has no objection on this. 10. In such view of the matter, the exemption application is allowed. 11.
