			<u>CRLR No. 391 of 2026</u> <u>Hon'ble Rakesh Thapliyal, J.</u> 1. Ms. Mamta Bisht, learned counsel for the revisionist. 2. The revisionist is aggrieved with the order passed by the Judge, Family Court, Haldwani, granting maintenance of Rs. 5,000/- to the wife and Rs. 2,000/- each of the sons who are respondent no.2 and 3 from the date of the filing of the application. 3. As per office report, there is a delay of 43 days and the delay is well explained. 4. In such view of the matter, the delay condonation application IA No. 01 of 2026 is allowed. The delay in preferring the revision is condoned. 5. Admit. 6. Summon the Trial Court Record. 7. It is argued by the learned counsel for the revisionist that the revisionist was serving in Army and now he left the job due to matrimonial discord and as on date he is not doing anything. Learned counsel for the revisionist submits that the respondent no.1- wife is living with her two sons i.e. respondent

			no. 2 and 3 in triple story house which was constructed by the revisionist. She also submits that she has also a land which the revisionist purchased in the name of respondent no.1-wife, and she is also getting the rental income. Apart from this, she submits that the elder son Lalit Koranga is now serving in Army as Major, despite this the Family Court granted maintenance of Rs. 2,000/- to the respondent no.2. 8. After hearing the learned counsel for the revisionist and taking into consideration that the dispute appears to be a matrimonial one, therefore, the efforts may be made for their amicable settlement. 9. Put up this case on 09.06.2026. On that day, the revisionist and the respondent no.1 shall remain present in Court. The revisionist shall inform the respondent about the proceeding. 10. In addition to this, the respondent no.2 who is the Major in Army shall also join the proceedings through V.C. In the meantime, for an interim measure the order impugned is stayed subject to the payment of Rs. 6,000/- as the maintenance to the respondent no.1. and the respondent no.3.
