Ms. Pushpa Bhatt, learned Addl. Advocate General along with Mr. S.C. Dumka, learned A.G.A. for the State.</p> <p>3. Mr. Harshpal Sekhon, learned counsel for respondent no.2/complainant.</p> <p>4. Present anticipatory bail application has been filed by the applicant seeking anticipatory bail in connection with F.I.R. No. 203 of 2026, dated 03.05.2026, registered under Sections 351(2) and 69 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 at Police Station Rudrapur, District Udham Singh Nagar, along with a prayer that no coercive measures be taken against him during the pendency of the application.</p> <p>5. Learned counsel for the applicant would submit that the impugned F.I.R. has been lodged alleging that the father of the complainant earns his livelihood by operating an e-rickshaw, while her mother is employed in a private company. It is alleged that whenever the complainant's parents were away for work, the applicant, who is stated to be a distant relative of the complainant, used to visit her house and gradually developed a close relationship with her. Thereafter, on the false promise of marriage, he allegedly established</p>

		<p>physical relations with the complainant and subsequently refused to marry her and started threatening her.</p> <p>6. Learned counsel for the applicant would further submit that prior to the lodging of the present F.I.R., the complainant had submitted a complaint dated 25.03.2025 wherein she stated that she was a resident of District Gurdaspur, Punjab, aged about 24 years. In the said complaint, it was alleged that in April, 2024, while residing at the house of her father's uncle, namely Palat Singh, she developed a love relationship with the present applicant, who is the son of Palat Singh, and during the course of the relationship they established physical relations on the promise of marriage. It is submitted that subsequently the complainant submitted another application stating that the parties had amicably settled their dispute and she did not wish to pursue the complaint any further. Learned counsel would further submit that, as per the terms of the compromise, it was agreed that if the parties failed to arrive at a final settlement by 01.04.2026, they would be at liberty to pursue their remedies before the appropriate forum in accordance with law.</p> <p>7. Learned counsel for the applicant would also submit that even prior to the registration of the present F.I.R., the mother of the applicant had submitted a complaint before the Superintendent of Police, Rampur, alleging that the complainant's family was attempting to</p>

grab the agricultural land belonging to her husband and was exerting pressure upon the applicant's family to solemnize the marriage of the complainant with the applicant. It was further alleged therein that the complainant's family had threatened to falsely implicate the applicant in a criminal case. Learned counsel submits that during the course of investigation, material improvements and exaggerations have been made in the allegations levelled by the complainant.

8. Having considered the submissions advanced by learned counsel for the applicant and upon perusal of the F.I.R. dated 03.05.2026 as well as the earlier complaint dated 25.03.2025, this Court finds that there appear to be certain discrepancies, particularly regarding the complainant's place of residence and other material aspects of the allegations, which require consideration during the course of investigation.

9. Accordingly, till the next date of listing, the applicant shall not be arrested in connection with F.I.R. No. 203 of 2026 dated 03.05.2026 registered at Police Station Rudrapur, District Udham Singh Nagar, provided he cooperates with the investigation and makes himself available before the Investigating Officer as and when required. The applicant shall further be subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The applicant shall make himself available for interrogation by the Investigating Officer whenever required and shall cooperate with the investigation

			<p>in all respects;</p> <p>(ii) The applicant shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat, promise or attempt to influence any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade such person from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;</p> <p>(iii) The applicant shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence or otherwise interfere with the investigation;</p> <p>(iv) The applicant shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court concerned and, if he possesses a passport, shall furnish the details thereof before the Investigating Officer/Court concerned;</p> <p>(v) The applicant shall not misuse the liberty granted by this Court and shall maintain good conduct during the period of protection;</p> <p>(vi) In the event of filing of a police report, the applicant shall cooperate with the trial and appear before the Court concerned as and when required, unless exempted in accordance with law.</p> <p>10.
