The petitioners, who are nine in numbers, are challenging the First Information Report dated 08.04.2026 bearing FIR No. 0042 of 2026 P.S. Shyampur, District Haridwar. They have been implicated for the offence punishable under sections 115(2), 651(2), 352 and 85 of BNS, 2023 r/w section 3/4 of Dowry Prohibition Act. <li data-bbox="643 983 1509 1709">4. It is argued by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner no. 1 Nitish Aswal married with the respondent/complainant on 26.02.2023 and from this marriage one female child was born on 11.11.2024 and thereafter after few months due to some matrimonial dispute she is now living separately at Ambala. He submits that different proceedings have been initiated by the respondent/complainant at Ambala but the impugned FIR has been lodged in Haridwar. He submits that petitioner want to settle all the disputes with the respondent-wife and still he want to live with her since he is very much worried about the female child. He also submits that let the respondent/complainant along with the child be called so that efforts may be made for their amicable settlement and he shall bear all expenses of travelling. <li data-bbox="643 1715 1509 1796">5.
