Mr. Deepak Bisht, learned Deputy A.G. for the State. 3. Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that this Court, vide order dated 03.06.2026, upon perusal of the video clips and photographs depicting blood-stained clothes and other material available on record, observed that, for the purpose of ensuring a fair and proper investigation and for ascertaining whether the case falls within the ambit of Section 103 of the B.N.S. or Section 107 of the B.N.S., it was necessary that a fresh post-mortem examination of the deceased be conducted. Accordingly, the Station House Officer of the concerned police station was directed to constitute a team for exhumation of the body from the graveyard and to hand over the same, in the presence of the petitioner, to the Chief Medical Superintendent, Sushila Tiwari Hospital, Haldwani, for conducting a post-mortem examination through a panel of doctors and for submitting the post-mortem report before this Court in a sealed cover. 4. In compliance with the aforesaid order, learned State counsel has

		produced the post-mortem report before this Court in a sealed cover for its perusal. 5. Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner would further submit that blood-stained articles, including the bed sheet and other incriminating materials collected from the place of occurrence, are material pieces of evidence, and it is necessary to ascertain whether the said articles have been sent to the Forensic Science Laboratory for scientific examination. 6. The State is directed to clarify as to whether the aforesaid blood-stained articles have been forwarded to the Forensic Science Laboratory. In the event the articles have been sent for forensic examination, the State shall place the forensic examination report before this Court in a sealed cover. 7. After perusal of the post-mortem report produced by learned State counsel, the same is returned to him with a direction to file the report along with an affidavit on behalf of the State.
