The controversy involved in this batch of writ petitions is regarding the regularization of the petitioner on the post of Junior Engineer in P.W.D.</p> <p>5. Learned counsel for the petitioners claims that the petitioners were working with the respondent-Department for more than ten years on contractual basis.</p> <p>6. Petitioners have been disengaged by the respondent-Department. Challenging the disengagement petitioners have filed these writ petitions before this Court and most of the petitioners got interim order against the order of their disengagement and therefore they are working, however, some of the petitioners are out of job.</p> <p>7. Learned counsel for the petitioners have relied upon judgment and order dated 11.06.2025, passed by Division Bench of this Court, wherein a direction has been issued to the Secretary, (P.W.D) to consider case of the petitioners, individually, and after making the seniority list of the</p> |

petitioners in the contractual appointment, they should be regularized against the vacant post of Junior Engineer including the future vacancy to be occurred within next six months from the date of judgment.

8. The respondent-Secretary (P.W.D) has not considered the case of the petitioner individually rather a committee was constituted by the Head of the Department and on the recommendation of the committee, regularization of the petitioners was rejected.

9. It is aggrieved by the said order the petitioners are before this Court.

10. Learned counsel for the State is directed to get instructions in the matter that as to how many vacancies are there on the post of Junior Engineer in the (P.W.D) and as to whether the cut-off date can be taken and extended in view of the order dated 22.02.2024, passed in WPSB No.616 of 2018, *Narendra Singh Vs. State of Uttarakhand*, within a period of ten days' from today.

11. List these cases on 01.07.2026.

12. Delink WPSS Nos.453, 454, 471, 475, 476, 478, 479 and 480 all of the year 2026 from the WPSS No.321 of 2026 and batch of writ petitions.
