			<p>ABA No. 214 of 2026</p> <p><b><u>Hon'ble Alok Mahra, J.</u></b></p> <p>Mr. Rakesh Sharma (through video conferencing) assisted by Mr. Jasmeet Sahota, learned counsel for the applicant.</p> <p>2. Mr. S.C. Dumka, learned A.G.A. for the State of Uttarakhand.</p> <p>3. Heard learned counsel for the applicant and learned State Counsel.</p> <p>4. The present Anticipatory Bail Application has been filed by the applicant-Sweta Sharma, seeking anticipatory bail in connection with FIR No. 0110 of 2026, dated 08.04.2026, registered at Police Station Gadarpur, District Udham Singh Nagar, for the offences punishable under Sections 115(2), 127, 137(2), 140(4), 316(2), 318(4), 47 and 49 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 and Sections 10, 16 and 24(G) of the Immigration Act.</p> <p>5. Learned counsel for the applicant submitted that the earlier Anticipatory Bail Application No. 656 of 2026 filed by the applicant was rejected by the Court of III<sup>rd</sup> Additional Sessions Judge, Rudrapur, District Udham Singh Nagar. He submitted that due to inadvertence, paragraph no. 1 of the present application mentions that this is the first anticipatory bail application filed by the applicant. He, therefore, sought permission of this Court to file an amendment application for correcting the said averment.</p> <p>6. Permission is accorded.</p> <p>7. Learned counsel for the applicant shall file the amendment application and carry out the necessary corrections in the application.</p> <p>8. Learned counsel for the applicant further submitted that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the present case. He submitted that although the applicant has been named in the FIR, no specific role has been assigned to her. It is further submitted that the applicant is a woman and is presently four months pregnant. Learned counsel has also pointed out that</p>

the applicant is the mother of a minor daughter aged about three years. In support of the said submission, a medical report has been annexed as Annexure No. 4 with the anticipatory bail application indicating that the applicant is four months pregnant.

9. Learned State Counsel prays for and is granted three weeks' time to file a counter affidavit.

10. Having heard learned counsel for the parties and considering the submissions advanced on behalf of the applicant, particularly the fact that the applicant is a woman, is stated to be four months pregnant and is also having a minor daughter aged about three years, this Court is of the view that the matter requires consideration.

11. As an interim measure, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, in the event of arrest during investigation, the applicant shall be released on interim anticipatory bail, subject to furnishing a personal bond with two reliable sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to the following conditions:

*(i) The applicant shall cooperate with the investigation;*

*(ii) The applicant shall not approach any witness in any manner whatsoever.*
