			<u>WPCRL No. 1151 of 2026</u> Anoop Kukreti and Others Petitioners Vs. State of Uttarakhand and Others Respondents. <u>Hon'ble Alok Mahra, J.</u> Mr. Arvind Vashistha, Senior Advocate, assisted by Mr. Jitendra Chaudhary and Ms. Devanshi Joshi, Advocates for the petitioners. 2. Mr. Vijay Pal, A.G.A. for the State of Uttarakhand. 3. By means of the present writ petition, petitioners seek quashing of F.I.R. No.0195 of 2026, under Section 105 of B.N.S., 2023, registered at Police Station Haldwani, District Nainital. 4. Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioner no. 1 is presently working as HR Payroll Manager, petitioner no. 2 is holding the post of Supervisor at the Amazon Delivery Store, Nehru Place, South Delhi, and petitioner no. 3 is posted as Regional Operational Manager at the Amazon Delivery Store, Noida, District Gautam Budh Nagar, under M/s M & M Logistic Solutions, a Delivery Partner of Amazon. It is submitted that all the petitioners have no concern whatsoever with the safety or operational issues of the Amazon Delivery Store/Warehouse situated at Haldwani. It is further submitted that the incident in question pertains to a fire that broke out in the warehouse of the company. According to the petitioners, the said incident occurred due to the negligence of the caretakers and other personnel stationed at the warehouse, who were allegedly charging electric bikes and e-rickshaws inside the premises. It is contended that

			an electrical short circuit/sparking during the charging process led to the outbreak of fire. Learned Senior Counsel further submits that the petitioners are posted outside the State of Uttarakhand at different delivery stores and were neither present at the site at the relevant time nor entrusted with any responsibility relating to the maintenance, safety, or operational management of the warehouse. It is thus argued that no prima facie material exists to connect the petitioners with the alleged occurrence and that their implication in the impugned F.I.R. is wholly unwarranted. 5. Admit. 6. As prayed, four weeks' time is granted to learned State Counsel to file counter affidavit. 7. List on 28.07.2026 with WPCRL No. 1135 of 2026. 8. Considering the submission advanced by learned counsel for the petitioners, it is directed that, till the next date of listing, investigation pursuant to the impugned F.I.R. may go on, however, petitioners shall not be arrested, provided they cooperate with the investigation. 9.
