**HON'BLE JITENDRA KUMAR SINHA, J.**

1. Sri Pawan Kumar learned counsel has filed his vakalatnama on behalf of the first informant which is taken on record.
2. Heard Sri Amit Daga, learned Senior counsel assisted by Sri Sandeep Kumar Srivastava, learned counsel for the applicant and Sri B.P. Singh, learned A.G.A. for the State and Sri Pawan Kumar, learned counsel for the first informant and perused the record.
3. Present application has been moved seeking anticipatory bail in Case Crime No. 608 of 2024, under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 504, 506, 120B IPC, Police Station Amroha Nagar, District Amroha with the prayer that in the event of arrest, applicant may be released on bail.
4. Learned Senior counsel for the applicant submits that applicant is innocent and he has an apprehension that he may be arrested in the above-mentioned case. He further submits that no offence is made out against the applicant. It is submitted that the applicant was granted interim protection from arrest by a Division Bench of this Court vide order dated 26.8.2025 passed in Criminal Misc. Writ Petition No. 18090 of 2025 till submission of the police report and now chargesheet has been submitted. It is further submitted that the applicant is bona fide purchaser for value and a suit for cancellation of sale deed has already been filed by the first informant which is pending before the civil Court. It was also submitted

that applicant undertakes to co-operate during trial and he would appear as and when required by the investigating agency or Court. It has been stated that in case, applicant is granted anticipatory bail, he shall not misuse the liberty of bail and will co-operate with the investigation and would obey all conditions of bail.

5. Learned counsel for the first informant prays for some time to prepare his argument.

6. Learned AGA has opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail.

7. It may be stated that in case of *Siddharam Satlingappa Mhetre v. State of Maharashtra*, (2011) 1 SCC 694, it has been held by Hon'ble Supreme Court that while deciding anticipatory bail, the Court must consider nature and gravity of accusation, antecedent of accused, possibility of accused to flee from justice and that Court must evaluate entire available material against the accused carefully and that the exact role of the accused has also to be taken into consideration.

8. Considering the above submissions of the learned counsel for the applicant and without expressing any opinion on merits, the applicant- **Rajendra Singh** involved in the aforesaid case crime be released on **interim anticipatory bail** on his furnishing a personal bond of Rs. 50,000/- with two sureties each in the like amount to the satisfaction of the Court concerned **till 23.2.2026** with the following conditions :-

(i) The applicant shall not tamper with evidence and that he would appear before the trial Court on the date fixed unless exempted by the Court concerned;

(ii) The applicant shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her/them from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;

(iii) The applicant would cooperate during trial and would not misuse the liberty of interim interim anticipatory bail bail.

(iv) The applicant shall not leave India without prior permission of the

Court concerned.

**8.** In default of any of the conditions, the prosecution shall be at liberty to file appropriate application for cancellation of interim anticipatory bail granted to the applicant herein.

**9.** List this case as fresh on 23.2.2026 in top 20 cases.

**10.** In the meantime, learned counsel for the first informant may prepare his argument and/or file counter affidavit.
