1. Shri R.S. Dubey, learned counsel for the revisionist submits that he has filed the instant criminal revision with the relief which has been mentioned in the prayer clause of the revision.

2. The relief which has been mentioned in the revision is delineated below:-

"It is, therefore, Most Respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to quash the impugned judgment and order dated 18-12-2025 passed by Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Court No. 3, Deoria in Maintenance Case No. 236 of 2025 (Shaili Vs. Sandeep) U/s 125 Cr.P.C. P.S. Gauribazar, District Deoria for enhance the maintenance amount in favour of revisionist.

It is further prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to stay the effect and operation of impugned judgment and order dated 18-12-2025 passed by Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Court No. 3, Deoria in Maintenance Case No. 236 of 2025 (Shaili Vs. Sandeep) U/s 125 Cr.P.C. P.S. Gauribazar, District Deoria for enhance the maintenance amount in favour of revisionist"

3. Learned counsel for the revisionist submits that the husband is already paying an amount of Rs.3,500/- per month in another proceeding even today. He further submits that in the present case, the Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Court No.3, Deoria has directed the applicant-

husband to pay Rs.10,000/- per month as interim maintenance to the wife.

4. Matter requires consideration.

5. Issue notice to opposite party No.2 for filing counter affidavit.

6. Counter affidavit shall be filed within a period of four weeks. Rejoinder affidavit may be filed within a period of two weeks thereafter.

7. List this case on 07.05.2026.

8. It is made clear that mere pendency of this case does not preclude the Family Court to execute the maintenance proceedings.
