1. Heard Mr. Rajesh Kumar Dubey, learned counsel for the applicant, learned A.G.A. for the State, Mr. Ravi Shankar Vishwakarma, learned counsel for the opposite party No.2 and perused the record.

2. This application under Section 482 Cr.P.C. has been filed by the applicant to quash charge-sheet dated 17.02.2005, cognizance/summoning order dated 04.07.2005 as well as entire proceeding of Criminal Case No. 429 of 2006, arising out of Case Crime No. 220 of 2004, under Sections 332, 323, 504 IPC, Police Station Bajaria, District Kanpur Nagar, pending in the court of learned Special Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kanpur Nagar.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant and informant have reconciled their differences and a compromise has been entered between them. The original compromise deed has been filed before the Trial Court i.e. learned Special Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kanpur Nagar and a certified copy of compromise deed dated 21.11.2025 has been annexed as Annexure No. 8 to this application. Therefore, no useful purpose would be served in continuing the proceedings before the Trial Court and the same is not only sheer wastage of time of the Court, but also abuse of process of law.

4. Learned A.G.A. submits that it is the Trial Court which has to verify the fact as to whether the parties have entered into a compromise.

5. Both the parties are directed to appear before the court concerned within six weeks from today for verification of compromise and the court concerned is directed to verify the same.

6. In case, the same is verified by the Trial Court, a copy of the order of the Trial Court alongwith a copy of compromise duly verified by the Trial Court, be filed before this Court within one week, thereafter alongwith supplementary affidavit before this Court, so that further action may be taken thereon.

7. Till verification of compromise or for a period of one month, whichever is earlier, no coercive action shall be taken against the applicant in the aforesaid case.

8. List this case on 17.04.2026.
