1. Heard Shri Rajeev Malviya, holding brief of Sarvesh Chaturvedi, learned counsel for the revisionist, Shri Shaurabh Kumar, holding brief of Shri V.P. Singh Kashyap, learned counsel for the opposite party no.2 as well as learned A.G.A. for the State and perused the record.

2. The present criminal revision has been filed with prayer to allow the revision and set aside the judgment and order dated 29.11.2023 passed by Principal Judge, Family Court, Budaun in Criminal Misc. Case No. 909 of 2022 (Kriti Sinha Vs. Manuj Manohar), under Section 125 Cr.P.C. Police Station Civil Lines, District Buduan.

3. Learned counsel for the revisionist submits that the matter is related to matrimonial dispute and the revisionist has intention to settle the same amicably. Learned counsel further urged that this case may be referred to the Mediation Centre of this Court so that they may have a chance to settle their dispute on their own terms through mediation. In order to show his *bonafide* the revisionist is ready to deposit Rs.125,000/- to be handed over to the opposite party no. 2 on her appearance before Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

4. The Court is also satisfied on the basis of the record and the submissions made before it that the nature of litigation is such that there is a chance to resolve the matter through

process of mediation and an attempt ought to be made to explore that possibility.

5. Accordingly, the matter is being referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, High Court, Allahabad. The revisionist will deposit Rs.1,25,000/- within one month from today at the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court through a demand draft out of which Rs.60,000/- shall be handed over to the opposite party no.2 on her first appearance and another Rs.60,000/- at her second appearance, out of which Rs. 1,20,000/- shall be subject to the adjustment in the amount of arrears of maintenance. It is further provided that Rs.5,000/- will remain deposited with the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, High Court, Allahabad.

6. The mediator is allowed three months' time to find out possible solution of the dispute between the parties and send his report to the Court regarding the outcome of mediation.

7. List thereafter before appropriate Bench along with report of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

8. This case shall not be treated as tied up or part heard to this Bench.

9. In the meantime, the effect and operation of the impugned order dated 29.11.2023 remain stayed. If any amount paid by the revisionist in favour of wife that will be subjected to adjustment.
