1. Heard Sri Abhay Mishra, learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Standing Counsel for the State and Sri Alok Kumar Singh, learned counsel for respondent Nos.4 and 5.

2. The present writ petition has been filed for quashing the impugned E-Mail sent on 13.06.2025 by the Empanelment Disciplinary Committee by which immediate suspension was made against the petitioner's facility, de-impaneling the petitioner's hospital (Hosp9p124586NHA) without affording any opportunity of hearing or inquiry by the EDC, State Agency for Comprehensive Health and Integrated Services.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner has relied upon various orders passed by this High Court and has also annexed by way of Annexure-7 an order dated 27.01.2006 passed in Writ-C No.1153 of 2026 (Gulawati Pulse Super Speciality Hospital Pvt. Ltd. Vs. Union of India and 5 others); whereby an identical order was subjected to challenge and the Court relying upon various orders including Writ-C No.20885 of 2025 passed in the case of Select Hospital Vs. Union of India and 4 others; coordinate Bench has set aside the orders of suspension on the ground that the same was an ex parte order and without affording any opportunity or application of mind.

4. Per contra, learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.4, 5 & 6 has placed on record an order dated 26.02.2026 by way of which the authorities have concluded the departmental proceedings and revoked the suspension in the cases where orders were passed by the High Court. He has

relied upon the said order to submit that the representation of 34 hospitals including that of the petitioner which has shown at serial No.05 in the said order has been disposed of, in the background that the police investigation is underway; and further State Health Agency U.P. has been directed to follow the orders passed by the High Court from time to time. From the said order, it is apparent that the entire exercise has been made subject to the outcome of the police investigation.

5. In view of the aforesaid fact, we find that the petitioner is also entitled to the same relief which was granted by this Court vide its order dated 27.01.2026 passed in Writ-C No.1153 of 2026; and accordingly the impugned Email dated 13.06.2025 is hereby set aside.

6. With the aforesaid observation, the writ petition stands disposed of.

7. It is also provided that the petitioner will be at liberty to move an application for the release of the payment which may be due to him for the services rendered under the Government Health Programme prior to the date of the empanelment, as stated by him. In case such a representation is made, the respondents are directed to decide the same within a period of three months from the date of service of this order.
