1. Heard learned counsel for the parties and learned A.G.A. for the State.
2. The present criminal revision has been preferred with the prayer to set aside the judgment and order dated 04.02.2025 passed by the Principal Judge, Family Court, Chandauli in Maintenance Case No. 392 of 2023 (Swati Dubey Vs. Kunal Tripathi) filed under Section 125 Cr.P.C., Police Station- Ali Nagar, District Chandauli.
3. Learned counsel for the parties submit that the matter is related to matrimonial dispute and the parties have intention to settle the same amicably. Learned counsel further urged that this case may be referred to the Mediation Centre of this Court so that they may have a chance to settle their dispute on their own terms through mediation.
4. The Court is also satisfied on the basis of the record and the submissions made before it that the nature of litigation is such that there is a chance to resolve the matter through process of mediation and an attempt ought to be made to explore that possibility.
5. Accordingly, the matter is being referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, High Court, Allahabad. The revisionist as well as opposite party no. 2 will deposit Rs. 2500/- each individually within two weeks from today at the Mediation Centre through demand draft. After deposit of the aforesaid amount, the Mediation Centre shall fix a date in the matter by calling upon both the parties to appear before the mediation centre so that the dispute may be resolved amicably. It is made clear that the amount of Rs. 5000/- shall be incurred in mediation expenses.
- 6 The mediator is allowed three months' time to find out possible solution of

the dispute between the parties and send his report to the court regarding the outcome of mediation.

7. List thereafter before the appropriate Bench along with report of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre.
