1. Sri Arun Kumar Bhatt, Advocate has made a statement at the Bar that he has filed vakalatnama on behalf of respondent No. 3 in the registry on 17.3.2026, however the same is not on record.
2. Office to trace out the same and place it on record.
3. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners, learned A.G.A. for the State, Sri Arun Kumar Bhatt, learned counsel for the respondent No. 3 and perused the record.
4. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioners has made a statement at the Bar that he does not intend to press this petition qua petitioner No. 1 and seeks to withdraw it.
5. In view of the above, the instant writ petition on behalf of petitioner No. 1 stands dismissed as withdrawn.
6. So far as petitioner Nos. 2 to 6 are concerned, learned counsel for the petitioners has further submitted that petitioner Nos. 2 and 3 are parents in-law while petitioner Nos. 4 and 6 are the brothers in-law and petitioner No. 5 is the sister in-law of respondent No. 3 and on account of matrimonial discord between husband and wife, the impugned first information report has maliciously been lodged against the petitioners.
7. Learned counsel for the petitioners has next submitted that general, vague and omnibus allegations have been made against the petitioners and only on account of the fact that they are near relatives of the husband of respondent No. 3, they have been dragged in, in the present case though no offence, whatsoever, is disclosed against the petitioner Nos. 2 to 6 and the impugned first information report qua the petitioner Nos. 2 to 6 is liable to be quashed.

8. Matter requires consideration.

9. Learned counsel for the respondent No. 3 prays for and is granted three weeks time to file counter affidavit.

10. Learned AGA may also file counter affidavit within the said period. Rejoinder affidavit, if any, may be filed within one week thereafter.

11. List on 19.5.2026.

12. Till then, the petitioner Nos. 2 to 6 shall not be arrested in pursuance of the impugned F.I.R. dated 19.2.2026 arising out of Case Crime No. 05 of 2026, under Sections 115(2), 316(2), 74, and 85 BNS and 3/4 of D.P. Act, P.S. Mahila Thana, District- Mainpuri.
