1. Heard Mr. Anil Bhushan, learned Senior Counsel assisted by Mr. Vijay Puri, learned counsel for the petitioners and Mr. Ashutosh Kumar Rai, learned Additional Chief Standing Counsel for the State-respondents.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that petitioners were proposed chak on plot nos.962, 963 and there was no proper chak objection against the proposal made in favour of the petitioners. He submitted that in the appellate jurisdiction, the chak of the petitioners proposed/ allotted on plot nos.962 and 963 was disturbed accordingly in revision, the appellate order was set aside and petitioners were allotted chak on plot nos.962 and 963. He submitted that petitioners are still in possession of the chak allotted on plot nos.962 and 963. He submitted that in writ petition filed by private respondents, matter has been remitted back before Deputy Director of Consolidation to decide the revision afresh and Deputy Director of Consolidation has dismissed the petitioners' revision without considering the entire aspect of the matter in proper manner as to whether allotment made to petitioners on plot no.962 and 963 can be disturbed if there is no proper objection against the proposal made in favour of the petitioner.

3. Matter requires consideration.

4. Issue notice to respondent no.3 returnable at an early date.

5. Steps be taken within ten days.

6. Respondent no.3 shall file counter affidavit within six weeks.
7. Rejoinder affidavit can be filed by the petitioner within two weeks thereafter.
8. List this matter on 25.5.2026.
9. Until further orders of this Court effect and operation of the order dated 3.11.2025 passed by respondent no.2-Deputy Director of Consolidation, Varanasi shall remain stayed and parties are directed to maintain status quo with respect to the nature and possession of the plot in question.
