1. The instant writ petition is preferred for quashing the impugned notice dated 11.12.2025 issued by the respondent no. 5(Annexure No. 5 to the writ petition). Further prayed for a mandamus directing the respondents not demolish the construction of the petitioner upon Khasra No. 787 area 0.2295 sq. meter situated in village Chuhadpur Khadar, Tehsil Sadar, District Gautam Budh Nagar.

2. At the very outset, Mrs. Anjali Upadhyay, learned counsel for the respondent-Authority raised two-fold objections qua maintainability of the writ petition. Firstly, the petitioners have invoked the writ jurisdiction challenging the impugned notice wherein, the proceeding are yet to be finalised to its logical end. Secondly, the petitioners have carried out certain development activities in an area, which falls in the territorial jurisdiction of the Greater Noida Authority. The duty is cast upon the Authority to ensure no development be carried out except in accordance with law in its territorial jurisdiction. Admittedly, the petitioners have ventured into development without recourse under the Act and accordingly notice has rightly been issued to the petitioners.

3. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and the objection so raised by learned counsel for the respondent-Authority, we are not inclined to entertain the writ petition at this stage. However, substantial justice would subserved in case, the petitioners file a detailed objection to the notice within 10 days time. We expect that the same would be

considered and decided by the Authority concerned, strictly in accordance with law within six weeks thereafter.

4. With the aforesaid observations and direction, the writ petition stands disposed of.
