HON'BLE MANISH KUMAR NIGAM, J.

1. On the basis of a report submitted by the Tehsildar mentioning therein that Arazi No. 443-Kh, old number of which is 558/1, is reported to be recorded as Bheeta in C.H. Form 41 and in the revenue records of Fasli 1356 and 1359, an order under Section 31/32 U.P. Revenue Code, 2006 has been passed expunging the entry of the *bhumidhar* to the land belonging to the Gram Sabha.
2. Contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that even before the zamindari, his ancestor was recorded over the land in dispute in the revenue records.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited my attention to C.H. Form 45 from which it is clear that Arazi No. 443-Kh is recorded in the name of "आद्य प्रसाद रमाशंकर पुत्रगण जगन्नाथ" and further submitted that the report submitted by the Tehsildar was incorrect. It has also been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that though, the co-tenure holder of the petitioner appeared in response to the notice, but no notice was served upon the petitioner. Lastly, it has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that this entire exercise has been done because the petitioner has refused to execute sale deed on the rate offered by the State Authorities as the land in dispute is under acquisition, and therefore, the order impugned has been passed.
4. Learned standing counsel has submitted that against the order impugned, the petitioner has alternative remedy of filing an appeal.

5. Matter requires consideration.

6. Respondent Nos. 1 to 6 are represented by learned Standing Counsel.

7. Respondents may file counter affidavit within a period of four weeks. Rejoinder affidavit, if any, may be filed within two weeks thereafter.

8. List thereafter.

9. Until further orders of this Court, order dated 30.10.2025 passed by respondent No. 4 shall remain stayed.
