1. Heard Sri Jai Prakash Singh, along with Sri Abhishek Tripathi, learned counsel for the applicant and Sri Rakesh Kumar Singh, State Law Officer.
2. The present application has been filed to quash the entire proceedings of Case No. 345 of 2024, including the chargesheet dated 17.02.2024 and summoning order dated 15.05.2024 arising out of Case Crime No.387 of 2023, under Sections-498-A, 323, 504, 506, 494 IPC, Police Station-Simbhawali, District-Hapur, pending in the court of learned Additional Civil Judge (Junior Division)/Judicial Magistrate, Garhmukteshwar, Hapur.
3. Contention of learned counsel for the applicant is that the present proceeding arises out of the offence which is matrimonial in nature, and therefore, the matter may be referred to the Mediation Centre.
4. In view of the above, the matter is referred to the Mediation Centre, High Court Allahabad, subject to the condition that the applicant will deposit a sum of Rs.25,000/- within 15 days from today with the Mediation Centre, out of which Rs.20,000/- shall be paid to the opposite party no.2 on her appearance before the Mediation Centre on a date to be fixed by the mediation center. Balance Rs.5,000/- shall be retained by the mediation center towards its expenses.
5. It is also directed that while depositing the amount before the Mediation Centre, learned counsel for the applicant shall also file memo

of parties as mentioned in the present case along with WhatsApp Number as well as Email-Id of the private respondent(s), if available.

6. Issue notice to opposite party no.2.

7. After depositing the aforesaid amount within aforementioned time, notices shall be issued to the parties fixing some date for mediation and the Mediation Centre shall make all possible efforts to conclude the mediation and conciliation proceedings expeditiously.

8. List in the week commencing 24.11.2025.

9. It is further provided, if applicant files receipt of deposit of the aforesaid amount before the court below then no coercive action shall be taken against the applicant in the aforesaid case, till the next date of listing.

10. It is also made clear that in case the applicant fails to submit the receipt of the aforesaid deposit before the court below then the court below would be free to proceed against the applicant.

11. It is clarified that interim order has been granted till the next date, if the applicant fails to produce any order of this court extending the interim order after the date fixed then court below would be free to proceed against the applicant.
