1. The instant writ petition has been filed with the following main reliefs:-

*"A. Issue a writ, order or direction in the nature of Certiorari for quashing the order dated 14.05.2025 (Annexure No. 6) passed by the respondent no. 2 i.e. Director of Education (Secondary) U.P. Lucknow.*

*B. Issue a writ, order or direction in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to include the name of the petitioner in the grant in aid list and to pay the arrears of salary in accordance with the provision contained in Govt. Order dated 27.10.2004 till the date of retirement.*

*C. Issue a writ, order or direction in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to pay the pension and other retiral benefits w.e.f 01.04.2019 and to pay as and when it falls due."*

2. Heard learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner, perused the contents made in the writ petition and documents on record.

3. Taking into consideration of the submissions and contents made in the writ petition, I am of the view that matter requires consideration.

4. Issue notice to respondent nos.4 & 7, by ordinary post as well as registered post on payment of PF within a week.

5. Sri Mashesh Sharma, learned counsel appeared on advance accepted

notice on behalf of respondent no.5 and Sri Akhilesh Chandra Srivastava, learned counsel appeared on advance accepted notice on behalf of respondent no.6 and Sri R.P. Tiwari, learned Standing Counsel appeared on advance accepted notice on behalf of State-respondent nos.1 to 3. They have vehemently opposed the petition and prayed for four weeks' time to file counter affidavit.

6. Let them file counter affidavit within four weeks.

7. Rejoinder affidavit, if any, may be filed within two weeks, thereafter.

8. List this case on 28.11.2025 among top ten cases.
