1. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is the son-in-law (Damad) and opposite party No.2 is the father-in-law (Sasur). He states that the matter shall be settled amicably, therefore, the matter may be referred to the Allahabad High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre (hereinafter referred to as "Mediation Centre").

2. Learned counsel for the applicant further submits that applicant is ready to pay Rs. 15,000/- to opposite party No.2 for expenses to attend the mediation and he will also deposit Rs. 5,000/- to the Mediation Centre towards the expenses of mediation.

3. The case is referred to the Mediation Centre for mediation/conciliation on **11.07.2025**.

4. Applicant shall deposit a sum of Rs. 20,000/- within two weeks from today in the Mediation Centre out of which Rs. 15,000/- shall be paid to opposite party No.2 for appearance before the Mediation Centre and the remaining amount shall go to Mediation Centre towards the expenses of mediation.

5. The concerned officer of the Mediation Centre is directed to send notice to opposite party No.2 on his level also.

6. Issue notice to opposite party No.2.

7. If the parties do not appear for the mediation on 11.07.2025, the Mediation Centre will provide another date after 10 days i.e. **22.07.2025**. Thereafter, this case shall be listed **as fresh on 24.07.2025** before the appropriate Court for adjudicating the case on merits or on the basis of the mediation report.

8. Till the next date of listing of this case, the effect and operation of the summoning order dated 07.04.2022 passed by II Additional Civil Judge (J.D.)/Judicial Magistrate Mohamdabad, Ghazipur in

Complaint Case No.185 of 2021 (Ramesh Mishra Vs. Krishna Kant Upadhyay), shall be kept in abeyance.

9. In case mediation fails, the interim protection granted shall not be extended and shall be treated as vacated.

10. In the meantime, if the parties wish to exchange pleadings, they may do so.
