1. The petitioner is present in-person.
2. The petitioner has filed the present application being CAN 1 of 2026 praying for recalling of the order dated March 5, 2026 wherein this Court has dismissed the writ petition for default for none appearance of the petitioner when the matter was called.
3. The petitioner submits that the petitioner had appeared in the morning hour but due to some personal difficulty could not appear in the second half when the matter was called, when the petitioner came to know that this Court has dismissed the writ application, the petitioner has filed the present application for recalling of the order dated March 5, 2026.
4. Learned counsel for the respondents raised objection and submits that the petitioner has not shown any cause why the petitioner had not appeared and as such the petition filed by the petitioner be dismissed. They further submit that the petitioner has made several

allegations in the present application though the respondents have not used the affidavit-in-opposition, the same may be treated as denied by the respondents.

5. Considered the submission made by the petitioner-in-person and the learned advocates appearing for the respondents, this Court finds that the petitioner has shown the sufficient cause for none appearance of the petitioner before this Court on March 5, 2026. Accordingly, the order dated March 5, 2026 is recalled.
6. WPA 2556 of 2026 is restored in its original file.
7. At the application has been disposed of without calling affidavit, accordingly, the allegation made in the application deemed to have been denied.
8. CAN 1 of 2026 is disposed of.
9. Let the matter appear on April 10, 2026 under the heading “Urgent Motion”.
