Petitioner herein has prayed for quashing of the proceeding being Chakdah Police Station Case No.429 of 2021 corresponding to G.R. Case No.308 of 2022 presently pending before learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Kalyani, Nadia.

Being aggrieved by the aforesaid proceeding, learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that she is the sister-in-law of the *de facto* complainant and no way connected with the alleged offence. She further submits that the allegations levelled in the complaint are omnibus in nature and no specific overtact has been attributed against any of the accused persons. However, after completion of investigation, the Investigating Agency has discharged two others sister-in-law /accused persons, namely, Papia Saha and Anindita Saha. Present petitioner, Dalia Saha, is almost on the same footing and, therefore, the instant proceeding is also liable to be quashed, *qua*, the petitioner.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioner, the application is admitted.

Petitioner is directed to serve a copy of application upon the State through the office of Public Prosecutor, High Court, Calcutta and upon opposite party no.2 through speed post intimating next date of hearing and to file affidavit of service on the returnable date.

Let the matter be listed in the Monthly List of August, 2026.

The petitioner has also prayed for interim relief.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioner and that the petitioner has made out an arguable case which requires adjudication on merit, let the impugned proceeding being G.R. Case No.308 of 2022 presently pending before learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Kalyani, Nadia be hereby stayed, *qua* the petitioner, Dalia Saha for a period of 12 weeks or until further order, whichever is earlier.
