**CRR 566 of 2026**

1. Affidavit of service filed by the petitioner is taken on record.
2. This revisional application has been filed for setting aside the order and judgment dated 19.11.2025 passed in Criminal Revision no.35 of 2025 whereby the learned Additional Sessions Judge, FTC III at Alipore dismissed the revisional application ratifying the impugned order dated March 27, 2025 passed in connection with Misc. Execution Case No.222 of 2024 passed by the Learned Judicial Magistrate, 4<sup>th</sup> Court at Alipore.
3. The present petitioner being the wife has come against that order since the execution proceeding was dismissed directing the opposite party to pay Rs.35,000/- per month to the petitioner and not Rs.70,000/-, which was passed by the learned Court of Additional District Judge in the judgment and order dated

November 30, 2023. Since the opposite party appeared on February 25, 2026 before this Court, the petitioner was directed to serve copy of the application upon the opposite party.

4. Learned advocate representing the opposite party prayed for adjournment till March 7, 2026 on the ground of learned senior advocate Mr. Sndipan Ganguly.

5. Learned senior advocate Mr. Ayan Bhattacharyee representing the petitioner submits that the present petitioner would be highly prejudiced if interim order is not granted.

6. Heard the submission, prima facie a case has been made out by the petitioner, which is required to be heard since the executing Court interpreted the judgment of the learned Court of Additional District Sessions Judge and arrived at a fresh conclusion by directing to pay Rs.35,000/- per month.

7. Hence, the prayer made by the opposite party and is considered. Let there be a stay for a period of till March 15, 2026 or until further order, whichever is earlier.

8. The matter be appeared on March 11, 2026 before the Regular Bench.
