1. Both the learned counsel for the petitioner and learned advocate for the private respondent no.10 prays for an accommodation for allowing them to file exception to the report dated 16.03.2026 as submitted today by Sabhadhipati, Purba Medinipur Zilla Parishad and the Affidavit-in-Opposition.

2. Such prayer is considered and allowed.
3. Two weeks time is hereby granted to the writ petitioner and the private respondent no.10 to file their exception and Affidavit-in-Opposition respectively.
4. List this matter under the same heading after three weeks hence.

At the time of hearing, Mr. Nilotpal Chatterjee, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent/State submits before this Court that due to inadvertent typographical omission, his name alongwith his junior, Ms. Soumi Guha Thakurata did not appear below the cause title of the earlier order dated 02.03.2026.
6. Mr. Chatterjee draws our attention to paragraph 6 of the order dated 02.03.2026, as passed by this Court. We find sufficient substance in the submission of Mr. Chatterjee.
7. Hence, we record that Mr. Nilotpal Chatterjee alongwith his junior, Ms. Soumi Guha Thakurata, learned counsel appeared on

02.03.2026 on behalf of the respondent/State  
in connection with the instant writ petition.

8. Let this order be treated as part of the order dated 02.03.2026.
9. On behalf of the Sabhadhiphati, Purba Medinipur Zilla Parishad, a report dated 16.03.2026 is filed, the same is taken on record.
10. The interim order as passed on 02.03.2026, is further extended till the last day of June, 2026 or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
