The petitioner being the son of the deceased employee claims compassionate appointment. The employee died on **June 13, 2019**. The petitioner applied on **July 31, 2019, annexure P-3** at **page 17** to the writ petition. Since then no heed was paid to the claim of the petitioner.

Mr. Kamal Kumar Chattopadhyay, learned advocate appearing for the respondents submits that, at present the Government of India has issued circulars and mentioned that the cadre in which the deceased employee was employed is a dying cadre and as such there is no scope for any compassionate appointment for the said cadre.

In view of the above, the respondent no. 3 shall file a report in the form of affidavit disclosing all the necessary circulars and records they want to rely upon, upon a copy being furnished to Mr. Victor Chatterjee, learned advocate appearing for the petitioner.



Such report shall be filed on or before April 22, 2025. The petitioner shall be at liberty to file its exception thereto in the form of affidavit by May 13, 2025.

The writ petition shall appear under the heading **“For Orders”** on **May 20, 2025**.
