1. Affidavit-of-service filed on behalf of the petitioner is taken on record.
2. Learned advocate representing the petitioner submits that he is owner of 7 decimal of land under LR Dag No.92 and another 86 decimal under LR Dag No.93 which is pond.
3. It is further contended that a party office was constructed over the said land of the petitioner unauthorizedly thereby infringing right of the petitioner to have peaceful possession over the said land in question.
4. A complaint was lodged with the concerned police authority dated 18th February, 2026 and prayer is made for direction upon the concerned police

authority to take necessary steps.

5. State respondents and respondent nos. 8, 9 & 11 are represented by learned advocates.
6. Learned advocate for the State respondents has filed a communication dated 24th March, 2026 of Inspector-in-Charge, Duttapukur Police Station, Barasat Police District and same is taken on record.
7. One memo dated 16th March, 2026 of Assistant Director and BL&LRO, Barasat-I, North 24 Parganas addressed to Sub-Divisional Officer, Barasat Sadar, Barasat is enclosed wherefrom it appears that name of the petitioner is present in Computerized Land Record in connection with the Khatian No.764 of Mouza-Tentulia (JL No.114).
8. On query being posed to the learned advocate representing the respondent no.8 relating to right of the said respondent no.8 over the land in question it could not be substantiated that respondent no.8 or respondent nos.9 & 11 have right over the land in question.
9. In view of aforesaid situation, Inspector-in-Charge, Duttapukur Police Station, Barasat being respondent no.7 is directed to cause detailed enquiry and submit a report disclosing as to how land of the petitioner was encroached by the private respondents.
10. Let such report be filed by four weeks from date.

11. List the matter under the same heading for further consideration on 18th May, 2026.
