1. The only grievance of the petitioner in the present writ application is that the Office of the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission at New Delhi had sent a notice to the opposite party by speed post being consignment No. CD780116485IN. After booking of the said, the petitioner has checked the website of the India Post but could not find whether it was served or not. Accordingly, the petitioner has made representation to the Postal Authority to ascertain whether the speed post cover was served upon the opposite party or not but no reply has been sent by the Postal Authority.
2. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that after filing of the writ petition and on tracking of the website of the India Post, it was found that the

speed post letter has been delivered on 2nd August, 2025.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the Postal Authority prays for time to take instruction to confirm whether the item was delivered or not.
4. In view of the above submission made by the learned counsel for the Postal Authority, the case is adjourned.
5. Let the matter appear on 19th March, 2026 under the same heading within five matters.
6. As the writ petition is pending before this Court, the learned National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, New Delhi is requested not to proceed with the matter in connection with Consumer Complaint No. 83 of 2025 until further order.
7. All parties shall act on the server copy of this order duly downloaded from the official website of this Court.
