1. Affidavit of service filed in Court today be kept with the records.
2. The petitioner is a retired employee of the Calcutta State Transport Corporation (CSTC). He alleges that some amount is due to him on account of leave encashment.
3. It appears that there is no representation from the side of the petitioner demanding his claim before the authority.
4. Prior to filing the instant writ petition, the petitioner ought to have approached the authority with his prayer for disbursement of leave encashment which is alleged to be due. Without filing the representation, the instant writ petition ought not to have been filed.
5. Nevertheless, as prayer has been made seeking liberty to file representation, the instant writ petition stands disposed of with the observation that it will be open for the petitioner to file representation before the authority highlighting his grievance.

6. If any representation is made, the same shall be considered by the authority in accordance with the prevailing rules.

7. A reasoned order shall be passed and communicated to the petitioner.
