This is an application wherein petitioner has prayed for quashing of the proceeding in connection with G.R. Case No.3545 of 2024 presently pending before learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barasat.

Being aggrieved by the impugned proceeding, learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the prosecution case pertains to an alleged cheating incident by one co-accused Madhumita Das @ Madhurima Das involving a forged NEFT transaction. The petitioner is a lawful gold trader but he has been falsely implicated solely on the basis of the statement of the principal accused without attributing any specific role against her. He further submits that no ingredients of cheating or criminal breach of trust are made out against the petitioner, particularly in absence of entrustment or inducement. Therefore, continuance of the impugned proceeding *qua* the petitioner, Dipanwita Das would be mere abuse of the process of the Court and, therefore, he prayed for quashment of the impugned proceeding.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioner, the application is admitted.

Petitioner is directed to serve a copy of application upon the State through the office of Public Prosecutor, High Court, Calcutta and upon opposite party no.2 through speed post intimating next date of hearing and to file affidavit of service on the returnable date.

Matter be listed in the Monthly List of May, 2026.

State is directed to produce the Case Diary on the date fixed.

Petitioner will be at liberty to pray for interim relief, if any, after service of copy to the opposite party.
