Prima facie, it appears that the present criminal proceedings have been instituted on the basis of a third F.I.R. The first F.I.R. was lodged on 7 March 2025, being Ausgram Police Station Case No. 96/2025 under Sections 318(4), 336(2), 336(3), 337, 338, and 340(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

Pursuant to the said F.I.R., a charge-sheet has already been filed by the investigating agency. In the present case as well, a charge-sheet has been filed on the basis of the second F.I.R.

Prima facie, it further appears that both criminal proceedings arise out of the alleged transfer of immovable property by the petitioner. It has been alleged in the charge-sheet that such transfer was effected to the prejudice of the other co-sharers.

In view of the aforesaid, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in connection with G.R. Case No. 3107/2025, pending before the Court of the Learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Purba Bardhaman, arising out of Ausgram Police Station Case No. 280/2025 dated 21 June 2025 under Sections 318(4), 316(2), 336(2), 336(3), 61(2), 351, 351(2), and 4(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya

Sanhita, 2023, for a period of twelve (12) weeks from the date of this order.

Let a copy of the application be served upon the opposite parties, with intimation that the matter shall be taken up for hearing after six (6) weeks. The petitioner shall file an affidavit of service to that effect on the next date of hearing.

Let the matter be listed along with **C.R.R. 1593 of 2026** after six (6) weeks under the heading “Contested Application.”

The State shall produce the case diary on the next date of hearing.
