Petitioners herein have prayed for quashing of the proceeding being G.R. Case No.2991 of 2025 presently pending before learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Raiganj. Investigation of the instant case has already been culminated into a charge-sheet.

Being aggrieved by the aforesaid proceeding, learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that they are innocent and the allegations levelled against them in the FIR are omnibus in nature and no specific overtact has been attributed against any of the petitioners. Petitioners' Counsel submits that the opposite party no.2/*de facto* complainant had left the matrimonial house without intimating any one and without any cause of action. The instant complaint is filed with a mala fide intention to wreak vengeance and spite the petitioners in the eye of people. She further drawn my attention to the charge-sheet submitted in this case which discloses that during investigation no evidence could be found under Section 109(1) of BNS. Furthermore, in spite of several requests, the *de facto* complainant did not produce any treatment paper or any other related documents to the Investigating Agency

during investigation. Therefore, the impugned proceeding is a *mala fide* one and further continuance of the same would cause great prejudice to the petitioners and would not yield any fruitful result.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioners, the application is admitted.

Petitioners are directed to serve a copy of application upon the State through the office of Public Prosecutor, High Court, Calcutta and upon opposite party no.2 through speed post intimating next date of hearing and to file affidavit of service on the returnable date.

Let the matter be listed in the Monthly List of August, 2026.

Learned Counsel for the petitioners also prays for interim relief.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioners and that the petitioners have made out an arguable case which requires adjudication on merit, let all further proceedings of G.R. Case No.2991 of 2025 presently pending before learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Raiganj is hereby stayed for a period of 8 weeks or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
