It appears from the page nos. 17 and 18 of the petition that the petitioner was on duty in Jammu & Kashmir on the date of alleged incident. The said fact, as it appears, was not considered by the Learned Magistrate while considering the discharge petition filed by the petitioner.

In that view of the matter, there should be a stay of all further proceedings of Sessions Case No.142 of 2023 arising out of Nalhati Police Station Case No.140 of 2020 (G.R. No.778 of 2020) dated 09.08.2020 under Sections 448/323/324/325/326/354/307/34 of the Indian Penal Code, in so far as the petitioner is concerned, for a period of 12 weeks from date.

Let the matter appear after six weeks under the heading "Contested Application".
