In this application, the petitioners have prayed for quashing of proceeding in connection with G.R. Case No.804 of 2022 arising out of Bidhannagar Electronics Complex Police Station Case no.138/2022 under Sections 498A/406/34 of the Indian Penal Code presently pending before learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bidhannagar.

Being aggrieved by the said proceeding, learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that the opposite party/complainant alleged cruelty against the petitioners which are baseless. The ingredients to constitute offence under Section 498A have not been made out in the entire allegation. However, after making perfunctory investigation, the police has submitted charge-sheet against the petitioners.

In the mean time, the petitioners have entered into an amicable settlement with the *de facto* complainant and to that extent they have executed a Family Settlement-cum-Understanding on 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2026. He further submits that in view of such settlement, further continuance of the impugned proceeding would

be mere abuse of the process of the Court and, therefore, prayed for quashment of the proceeding.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioners, the application is admitted.

Petitioners are directed to serve a copy of application upon the opposite party no.1 through the office of Public Prosecutor, High Court, Calcutta and upon opposite party no.2 through speed post intimating next date of hearing and to file affidavit of service on the returnable date.

Let the matter be listed in the Monthly List of June, 2026.

State is directed to produce the Case Diary along with a report on the alleged compromise by the date fixed.

Learned Counsel for the petitioners also prays for interim relief.

Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioners and relying upon her submission that the parties have already entered into an amicable settlement, let all further proceedings of G.R. Case No.804 of 2022 presently pending before learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bidhannagar be hereby stayed for a period of eight weeks or until further order, whichever is earlier.
